ONE MORE STEP TOWARDS SEXUAL DISARMAMENT IN ARMED CONFLICT

Sexual violence is an international crime, which continues to be perpetrated in the context of too many international conflicts, where it is used as a tactic of war. As Congolese activist Caddy Adzuba has repeatedly denounced, through sexual violence, war is waged on women's bodies, tearing them, their families and their communities apart.

International law has enshrined an absolute prohibition and an obligation to prosecute and punish these crimes, which must not go unpunished. The reality, however, is that the investigation and punishment of these crimes face multiple obstacles. Despite advances in the legal field and the creation of international criminal tribunals, whose jurisdiction covers these crimes, the fact remains that impunity continues to be the general rule.

The UN Security Council Resolution 2467 (2019) ended the unanimity and showed that the danger of regression in relation to the recognition of both the rights of survivors and the specificity of this type of violence is very real.

In this context, the approval of the new NATO Policy on preventing and responding to Conflict-Related Sexual Violence (CRSV) is a very relevant milestone. In the case of Spain, this step forward by NATO is in line with our country's commitment to the Women, Peace and Security (WPS) Agenda, which is a fundamental element of the feminist foreign policy concept to which Spain has adhered, and to human security contemplated in the National Defence Directive 2020, that according to the External Action Strategy (2021-2024), must be placed at the centre of the agenda.

The objective of this conference is to analyse and raise awareness of the need to prevent and combat sexual violence in armed conflicts. We will have the testimony of activists committed to the fight against sexual violence in their respective countries; and we will also have the opportunity to debate and reflect on how to prevent and eradicate this scourge with government, international organisations and civil society organisations representatives.
